Tutorial Burdastyle July 2017 model 126



I found the pattern in this magazine: Burdastyle July 2017

Because I didnt knew how to do the pockets I took the pattern to my sewing course and made the Mickey Mouse dress (Size 7) you can see above.

For the next dress I choosed a fabric with school supplies because little Miss M. will wear it on her very first day at school





Cut front (1), back (2), 2x both pieces for he pockets (3+4). Add ½" seam allowance to all pieces


I couldn't found the pattern for (5) and (6) in my magazine but they are needed. Take the front and back pattern for it and short it down to 2 under the armpits.

Round it down a little






I started with the pockets first.



Use an ½" seam for the whole dress



Make a lot of small cuts close to the seam. The smaller the cuts the better the rounded form will look when turned




Turn the pocket piece to the left side and iron it



Turn your piece and make a seam close to the edge



Put the red piece with needles under your fabric



Make a **few stitches** on both sides. Just to make sure it wont move when you'll sew the pocket





Sew as I showed with the arrows



If you have an Overlock, use it. Or make zigzag stitches around the pocket.


Your pocket is done



Now lay both fabrics on its right side and sew the inlet as marked with the arrows.




Make a lot of small cuts close to the seam. The smaller the cuts the better the rounded forms will look when turned




Shorten the cuts to the half



Turn your piece to the right side.



Iron it



Make a seam close to the edge



Overlock it or use a zigzag stitch



Sew the sides of the dress




Overlock the sides or use a zigzag stitch



Now sew the seam of the dress. With skirts and dresses I always make an 1"seam. This way

Miss M. can wear this cute dress the next summer too
